No.	Question	Answer
A1	What is a Tuition Grant?	<p>The Tuition Grant (TG) is a grant by the Government to help students manage the costs of full-time tertiary education in Singapore. It is applicable to eligible Singapore Citizens (SC), Singapore Permanent Residents (SPR) and International Students (IS) enrolled in full-time diploma or undergraduate courses at our autonomous universities (i.e. NUS, NTU, SMU, SUTD, SIT and UniSIM), polytechnics (i.e. SP, NP, TP, RP, and NYP), and art institutions (i.e. NAFA, and LASALLE).</p> <p><u><i>For eligible SC:</i></u> There is no bond obligation for Singapore citizens who receive the Tuition Grant.</p> <p><u><i>For eligible SPR and IS:</i></u> In return for taking up the Tuition Grant, you are required to work for a Singapore entity for 3 years upon graduation.</p> <p>You are advised to obtain the Tuition Grant sample agreement (https://tgonline.moe.gov.sg/docs/TG-SampleAgreement.pdf) from the TGonline website and read the terms and conditions carefully before you sign it.</p>
A2	What is the amount of Tuition Grant?	<p>The amount of Tuition Grant (inclusive of any GST) depends on the course and the nationality of the student.</p> <p>You may check with your institution the prevailing Tuition Grant amount for your year of admission or refer to the Tuition Grant amount in your Student Bill.</p>
A3	Am I eligible to apply for the Tuition Grant Scheme?	<p>You are eligible for Tuition Grant Scheme if you have not already taken any Tuition Grant or Singapore Government sponsorship to attain another equal or higher level qualification (including those that you have received for previous uncompleted course, if any).</p>
A4	Am I allowed to take up a scholarship as a Tuition Grant recipient?	<p>Yes, Tuition Grant recipients are allowed to take up a scholarship and its bond can be served concurrently with the Tuition Grant bond.</p>
